



Renminbi Programme of the Central Bank of Hungary and the Budapest Renminbi Initiative

The Central Bank of Hungary (Magyar Nemzeti Bank, MNB) was the first Central European central bank that signed a bilateral currency swap agreement with the People's Bank of China in 2013. The Renminbi Programme of the central bank was launched in February 2015. Soon thereafter, in March 2015 the Budapest Renminbi Initiative was introduced, which creates a framework and forum for cooperation for all relevant stakeholders. The Renminbi Programme determines those fields, which the central bank aims to examine and in which the central bank would act on its own. The Budapest Renminbi Initiative is related to the aims of the Renminbi Programme and it provides a forum for discussion to relevant stakeholders in order to determine the potential fields for development and exchange views and experience.

In line with the aims of the Programme, the Central Bank of Hungary invested a part of its FX reserves in RMB denominated Chinese government bonds and supported the involvement of the renminbi in the SDR basket.

In the past years expansive developments have been achieved on the capital, financial and foreign exchange markets also with regard to Hungarian-Chinese relations. In 2015 the People's Bank of China decided to extend the Renminbi Qualified Foreign Institutional Investors Program to Hungary with a total investment quota of 50 billion renminbi. As for the RMBHUF market development, more and more banks have introduced RMB services in Hungary and in line with the aims of the Programme, direct RMBHUF trading started in onshore Chinese currency markets. In January 2017 the HUF was introduced to the CFETS RMB index.

In 2015 the People's Bank of China and the Central Bank of Hungary signed a Memorandum of Understanding that has contributed to the establishment of a Central and Eastern European renminbi clearing centre in Budapest by the Bank of China aimed at providing proper infrastructure to the settlement of renminbi transactions and widening the range of financial services to clients.

Regarding academic cooperation, the Central Bank of Hungary has already signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Fudan University and sponsors the participation of Hungarian attendees at the summer course of Fudan University.

The Central Bank of Hungary is also committed to further strengthening the scientific and educational cooperation between China and Hungary. The Central Bank of Hungary concluded a trilateral partnership agreement on an MBA double degree university course with the Fudan University of Shanghai and Corvinus University of Budapest. The programme was developed with the professional support of the Hungarian Central Bank. The course has been announced on the Pre-Forum Session of Shanghai Forum organised by the Central Bank of Hungary in Budapest in October 2018 and has been launched in February 2019 as the first Chinese academic programme in the region.

The Central Bank of Hungary also presented Chinese-language special issues of the scientific periodical Financial and Economic Review in 2018 and 2019.

The Central Bank of Hungary in conjunction with the People's Bank of China organised the first '16+1' summit of Central Bank Governors from China and the Central and Eastern European countries in Budapest in November 2018.

The Central Bank of Hungary annually organises international conferences as part of the Budapest Renminbi Initiative. Within the framework of the latest event, which was held in Budapest in March 2019, the first Alipay terminal was presented in Hungary, through which China's most widespread mobile payment method would be available for Chinese users.

This year the 70th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Hungary and China is commemorated, and Hungary aims to further improve the comprehensive bilateral strategic partnership. The Central Bank of Hungary also committed itself to strengthen the existing cooperation and to set new agreements.
